B. Public Comment – Hollie Siegel, Jason Wiens and Chris Burt applied for committee membership and attended meeting. Committee requested all three applicants be referred to Mayor for approval to join committee.

C. Completed Action Items

1. VGBA grates were replaced by Commercial Aquatics for \$3,288.62.

D. Open Action Items

1. Website updates for 2022. – Tony Nichols put temporary updates on the site. Website will be updated by 2022 with pass sales information. Kansas City Blazers link will be removed from website.
2. Outstanding maintenance and projects.
 - a. Green space sod – Tony updated the group that Royal will begin installation Wednesday December 22. Staff will turn water on to pump house building to water in new sod.
 - b. Repaint slick areas in zero depth – remains on agenda to address spring 2022.

E. New Business

1. Finalize After Hours Events planning (pricing) – Committee approved pricing plan for after hours special events. Family Fun nights: Season Pass Holders – Free, Resident Single Admission - \$4, Non Resident Single Admission - \$5. Movie Night: Season Pass Holders - \$3, Resident Single Admission - \$6, Non Resident Single Admission - \$8. Leonard Tocco will bring options for movie to next meeting.
2. Operations Plan Discussion and Approval – Tony Nichols shared Operations Plan for 2022 season for committee approval. Plan called for closing of slides at 4:40p every week night of evening swim lessons to provide space to teach swim lessons, committee asked staff to find alternatives to teaching lessons in the slide catch pools. The water depth at the base of slides is ideal for swim lessons and alternate locations are all over 4 feet deep. Staff suggested the purchase of “tot docks” that can be used to safely teach lessons in deeper areas of the pool in order to keep slides open to public. Staff will follow city purchase approval process for acquisition of “tot docks”. Committee approved operations plan and staff will present to City Council at Jan 3rd meeting.
