Q&A with Your New Council Members

Ward 3 Councilmember

Q: What do you do for a living?

A: I'm the President & CEO of a local nonprofit called First Call Alcohol/Drug Prevention & Recovery. First Call has been serving the KC metro for 65 years, and we provide substance use prevention, education and recovery support services. I've worked there for 13 years, almost three of which have been as the leader of the organization.

Q: How long have you lived in Roeland Park?

A: My husband Erik and I purchased our first home ever in Roeland Park and it's where we still live today. We bought our home in 2012 and quickly became lifers!

Q: Why did you run for Council?

A: I am deeply aware of the fact that community is built intentionally, and ours in Roeland Park is particularly special. I want to be able to give back and also participate in ensuring that RP remains a welcoming, affordable, safe and inclusive community.

Q: Tell us about your family.

A: I am married to my college sweetheart, Erik, and we have two daughters who attend Roesland Elementary; Ellen and Violet. Our family loves playing games, enjoying local spots on Johnson Drive and learning new things - our youngest is currently learning lots of new cooking skills and Violet joined a swim team this year.

Q: What do you enjoy doing in your free time?

A: I love cooking, gardening, and going to barre classes. I am also trying to start running this year, so wish me luck and wave if you see me out! But most of all, in such a busy season of life, my favorite thing is being with my family.

Q: What do you do for a living?

A: I'm the principal and co-owner of a small architecture firm, RDM Architecture, and have been since we took over in early 2020. We do primarily single family residential with a mix of new construction and remodel projects.

Q: How long have you lived in Roeland Park?

A: That is an easy one to remember! My wife and I moved to Roeland Park when our son was 2 and just before our daughter was born so we've been here 10 years.

Q: Why did you run for Council?

A: I think it is important to be involved otherwise you're just along for the ride. It is how I ended up going door to door to get support for the sidewalk along Buena Vista and later joined the Planning Commission and then the Parks and Trees Committee. When a council seat became available I thought I would have something to offer and applied for it. I didn't get it. I was more disappointed than I'd anticipated so, with some encouragement from Mayor Poppa, I decided to run for the other seat.

Q: Tell us about your family.

A: My wife Sara and I have two kids, Wren and Isaac, who are in 5th and 6th grades at Roesland Elementary. We've got three cats, Rachel, Carrot and Turnip (who turned up last year and never left) and a whole lot of guppies.

Q: What do you enjoy doing in your free time?

A: So many things. The one that takes up the most of my time (and garage space) is sailing! I'm the Commodore of the Johnson County Sailing Society and can be found at Shawnee Mission Park Lake racing, teaching or just taking folks for a spin just about every weekend during the season.

SUSTAINABLE ROELAND PARK

Roeland Park cares about being green! The City has taken steps to reduce our carbon footprint and help move the region toward a sustainable future for our residents. Here are some highlights of our initiatives.



CURBSIDE *glass recycling*

Since curbside collection started in 2023, Roeland Parkers have recycled **95.17 tons of glass!** That's equivalent to nearly 32 elephants worth of glass!

SOLAR

The City installed solar at the Community Center, on the pool pump house, at city hall on the roof and in the parking lot in June of 2021. Since inception, this installation has **saved over 1 million pounds of carbon emissions** from the atmosphere! That's equivalent to nearly 8,000 trees planted!

Don't forget to set your glass bin out on the 1st trash day of the month!!



HOME ENERGY AUDITS

Since inception in 2022, the Residential Energy Audit Incentive Program has granted 11 households with an energy audit. The City reimburses residents up to \$400 for an energy audit from a qualified contractor. All residents are eligible for this program!



Hybrid & Electric Fleet

The City is driving the move toward EV and Hybrids! Neighborhood Services vehicles transitioned to EVs in 2022. The City is also working toward transitioning its Police fleet to hybrids. The City has its first hybrid police vehicle and plans for more as planned vehicle replacement occurs..

Roeland Park Cares

The Holiday Kindness Project and the Holiday Family Adoption Program were huge successes, thanks to the generosity of our neighbors, business partners, and supporters. Organized by Neighbors for a Better Roeland Park, the Holiday Kindness Project started in 2020. Police officers hand out donated gift cards for local businesses to those in need. In 2023, 133 gift cards, at a value of \$10-\$20 each, were donated by our residents and handed out to unsuspecting shoppers in Roeland Park.

In partnership with the City of Mission, the City of Roeland Park has been participating in the Holiday Family Adoption program where local families in need are provided Christmas gifts and food for Thanksgiving and Christmas. This year, the City adopted six families and provided for nearly every gift requested.

Lower Crime Rate in 2023!

The results are in! There are eight categories of crime that make up the Uniform Crime Report. This includes homicide, rape, robbery, aggravated assault, burglary, theft, vehicle theft and arson. The number of incidents is divided by our population and in 2023 our Crime Index hit a three-year low at 32! A big, big thank you to our Roeland Park Police Department for their efforts this year!
