



## October 29, 2024 RP DEI Committee- Meeting Minutes

- Follow up from last month's business
    - Approve [September minutes](#)
    - *Emily motioned to approve, Haile seconded*
  - [City/Council Updates and Follow-up](#)- read September sections. Time for questions.
    - *The council reviewed September updates, allowing time for questions. The Nall Park Master Plan included a discussion on accessible playgrounds, though the path to Boulevard Apartments and Nall Park was not addressed. Discussion on Chapter 5 of the Fireworks Code was postponed to the next meeting. Grant program updates were also covered, including adjustments to the Property Tax Assistance program, now setting income limits at 80% of 2024 HUD rates, with properties capped at 125% of the median household income. The NHN grant program was revised to permit only one grant every three years. Finally, there was a push for improved marketing and awareness, emphasizing the need for accessible and translated application forms.*
  - Updates from last month
    - *During the Johnson County DEI Committee update, Haile announced plans to present the 2025 action plan to the commission next week. The recent Trunk or Treat event was successful, with over 60 flyers distributed and new committee interest generated through city communications and social media. Jennifer shared insights from the Welcoming Cities Lunch & Learn, highlighting how Gardner and Dodge City, with majority Hispanic populations, have adapted communication strategies to improve engagement. Welcoming Cities certification efforts require significant investment but offer tools the committee could utilize. Emily and Carrie shared feedback on the recent implicit bias training, noting that while insightful, the session could benefit from increased interactivity.*

- Historical Committee Land Acknowledgement
  - Carrie shared the final Land Acknowledgement statement from the Historical Committee. The focus is to inform and affirm that RP has Indigenous relationships in our history. Given this focus, Haile raised the question- should it be called something other than Land Acknowledgement then? Perhaps Land History? The DEI Committee does not want to slow this process but will share this feedback with the Historical Committee and possibly seek Curtis' input.
